## **MARS**

Downtown, "Mars" brings together nine more junge österreicher who work in everything but bricolage, although Ricarda Denzer works with found posters for Turkish B - no, D - movies from the '70s, which cheese she bricollates into a surprisingly gripping video. Segued images from still sources animated via video is also Arye Wachsmuth's strategy in a piece superimposing antiseptic interiors from design magazines. Wachsmuth also recycles lines quoted from films - real kino-queen aphorisms; the only one most of us will recognize is "what a dump!" A peculiar scratchboard drawing by brother Simon Wachsmuth populates the big Western sky with a plethora of suns, while a plethora of cigarette butts populates one of Constanze Ruhm's large, surprisingly beautiful red-filtered reconstructions of film stills. There's more video from not-quitevoyeur Martin Hanf, casually glancing up at night and seeing people doing interesting-seeming things in front of windows. Adi Rosenblum and Markus Muntean collaborate on hilariously odd pose-and-prop performances and comic books for (it would seem) terminally disaffected adolescents. Christoph Hinterhuber fills the halls with inflatable sculptures designed off a computer, while Christine Gloggengiesser fills the walls with silhouettes of the Hollywood sign letters - at original scale.
